

  - Projects to be completed by Property Committee:
    - Church: Panel over the speakers in the steeple with maintenance free PVC board. The light pole to illuminate stained glass windows and the Christmas tree for the front of church needs to be rewired or replaced. The asphalt shingles on the addition at the back of church need to be replaced. Door for crawlspace under wheelchair ramp needs to be replaced.
    - Church Hall: The door at the back of hall needs to be replaced (Annabelle Phillips to fund).
    - Church Office: Clean gutters and add an additional downspout to the left side front of building. Replace columns and paint front entrance and attic window. Repair windows in foundation
  - Proposed projects to be completed by vendors:
    - Church: After panels over speakers have been installed and proven effective, the ceiling will need repairs in several areas.
    - Church Hall: The carpet in hallway by restrooms and kitchen needs replacing with linoleum. Paint and caulk all windows.
    - Parking lots: Both the church and hall parking lots are in need of milling and resurfacing.
  - Completed Tasks:
    - The leaks in the gable valleys on the church roof have been repaired by Ray Gable (Cost \$345).
    - The Gravel has been spread on the lot across from the church.
    - Chair lift to complete access to all levels of the church hall has been installed.
    - Air-conditioner was installed in book sale area of church hall.
    - Tree limb by electric feed to building has been trimmed.
